D'Orsay began her career as a member of the Toronto-based improv troupe Trailervision, where she cut her teeth as a comedic performer. She then proceeded to voice the character of Caitlin Cooke on the popular Canadian animated sitcom "6Teen." After moving to Los Angeles, she went on to star in FOX's "Happy Hour" and CBS's "Gary Unmarried." Additional small screen credits include fan favorites "The Big Bang Theory," "How I Met Your Mother" and "Two and a Half Men," in which she played Ashton Kutcher's recurring love interest. Many fans also recognize her from playing Deb Dobkins, the lamented diva in the Lifetime comedy-drama series "Drop Dead Diva."

D'Orsay has made us laugh on the large screen in the cult classic *Harold & Kumar Go to White Castle*, followed by New Line Cinema's *King's Ransom*, and Jennifer Aniston's directorial debut, *Room 10*. She also starred in the Hallmark Channel original movies "Christmas in Love," "Miss Christmas," "June in January" and "How to Fall in Love."

SAM PAGE (Pat) – Sam Page had the distinction of simultaneously juggling three recurring arcs on such beloved series as AMC's Golden Globe®- and Emmy® Award-winning "Mad Men," the worldwide phenomenon "Desperate Housewives" and acclaimed ABC Family series "GREEK." His popularity likely originates from his role on the daytime drama "All My Children," which garnered him a slot amongst People Magazine's Most Eligible Bachelors. While his role as Christina Hendrick's surgeon husband on "Mad Men" continued, Page joined yet another cast in the form of an arc on "Gossip Girl"; has since appeared in multiple episodes of "Switched at Birth"; and most recently, the Netflix original series "House of Cards" with Kevin Spacey and Robin Wright. He also collaborated with creator David Fincher on HBO's "Living on Video," and currently stars as Richard Hunter in the Freeform series "The Bold Type," which is inspired by the life of Cosmopolitan editor-in-chief Joanna Coles.

Additionally, he has appeared on "Scandal," "The Mindy Project," "Unbreakable Kimmy Schmidt," "Necessary Roughness," "Adam Ruins Everything," "Stalker," "Last Resort," "Up All Night," "The Event," "Castle" and "Lie to Me." Page previously starred as a handsome district attorney with a heart of gold on the CBS drama "Shark." Additional credits include recurring arcs on the likes of "American Dreams," "Seventh Heaven," and Ryan Murphy's scathing look into the high school experience, "Popular."

Born in Milwaukee, Page earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in ecology and evolutionary biology from prestigious Princeton University where he also played baseball. Upon graduation, he moved to Manhattan to focus on his acting career. He eventually moved west to Los Angeles where he currently resides.
